



2010/2011 Master's Degree Recipients Survey Report

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Summary

Four hundred and ninety-three 2010/2011 master's degree recipients were sent graduate surveys in January of 2012. Eighty-seven graduates (18 %) responded to the survey and the results are summarized in this report.

The respondents were mostly females who were largely of white ethnicity. Nearly all of these graduates said they would highly recommend the master's degree program at New Jersey City University to others and, given the opportunity, they would choose NJCU again themselves.

A majority of the respondents did not have an opinion about campus security, but they thought the hours classes were offered were convenient. When asked if weekend classes would have been preferred, of those with an opinion, more were not in favor of classes on weekends.

Thirty-one percent reported they lived in Hudson County while they attended their graduate courses while 15% lived in Bergen County. The ages of the respondents were distributed almost evenly between the ages of "25" and "45 or older." Twenty-two percent received their bachelor's degrees at NJCU and 68% took their first graduate course at the main campus. Most of the respondents have not enrolled elsewhere since obtaining their master's degrees, however 35% report that their highest degree planned is a doctorate.

Nearly all of the respondents are currently employed and most are working in the education field and are making between \$50,000 and \$69,000 per year. Half of the survey takers were education majors at NJCU. Thirty-eight percent of respondents said they completed their master's degrees in three years while 25% reported it took them 2 years or less.

As for the reasons they choose NJCU as their graduate school, nearly all replied that both tuition and the specific graduate programs offered were the most important factors.

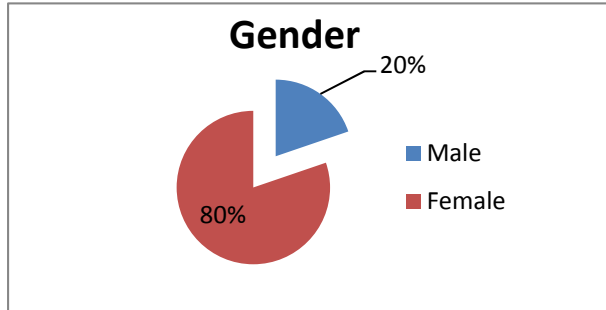
Forty-three percent said that if they had a problem at NJCU it was related to course availability and half of the respondents said that a faculty member was helpful in resolving the problem. Most of the respondents felt their advisors were helpful and their professors were available outside of class. They also felt they made good professional contacts through their program.

The graduates were asked if they would have utilized a space on campus which was dedicated to graduate students and if so, what type of space they would have liked. The reply was split almost evenly between "Yes" and "No". For those in favor, the most popular response was they would like the space to be a combination of a study space, meeting space, lecture space, coffee bar and informational center.

Graduate Survey Respondent Profile:

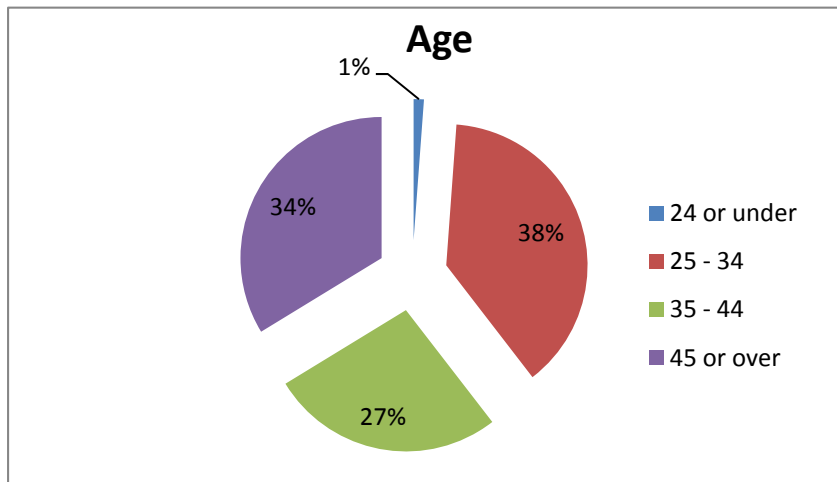
The majority of the respondents (n=65; 80%) were female (Figure 1).

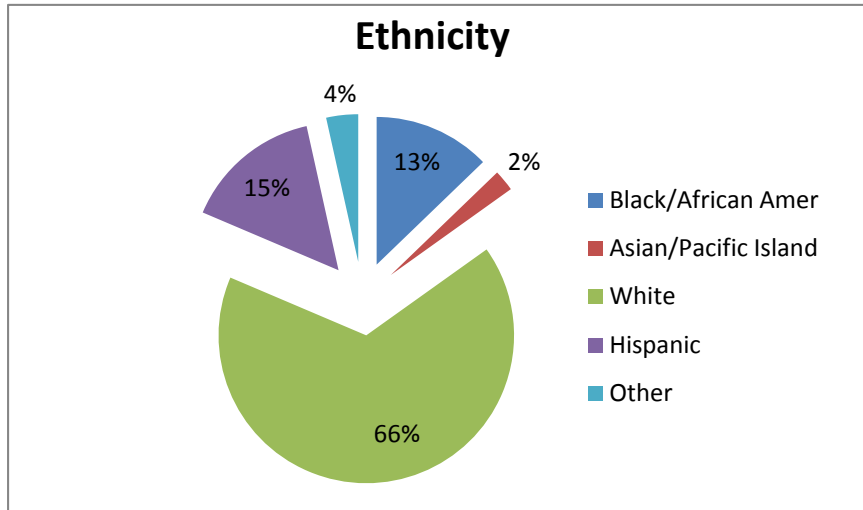
They are mostly between the ages of twenty-five and thirty-four (38%; n= 33), with 34% (n=29) being forty-five or older and 27% (n=23) being between thirty-five and forty-four years old (Figure 2).

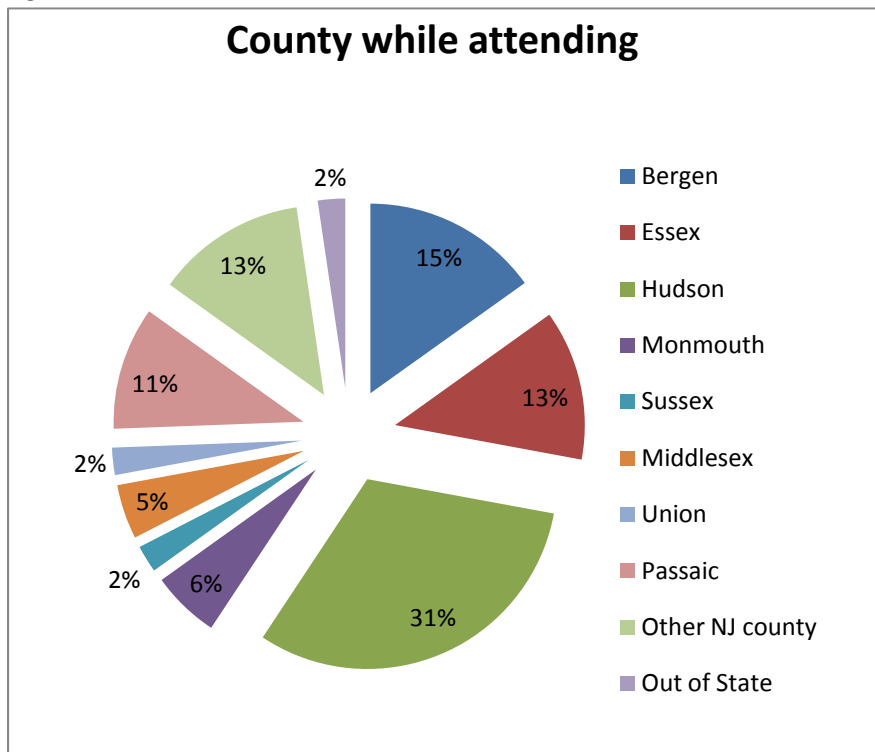
Ethnically, 66% (n= 57) are White, 15% (n=13) are Hispanic and 13% (n= 11) are Black. Two Percent (n=2) are Asian and 4% (n= 3) reported "Other" for their ethnicity (Figure 3).

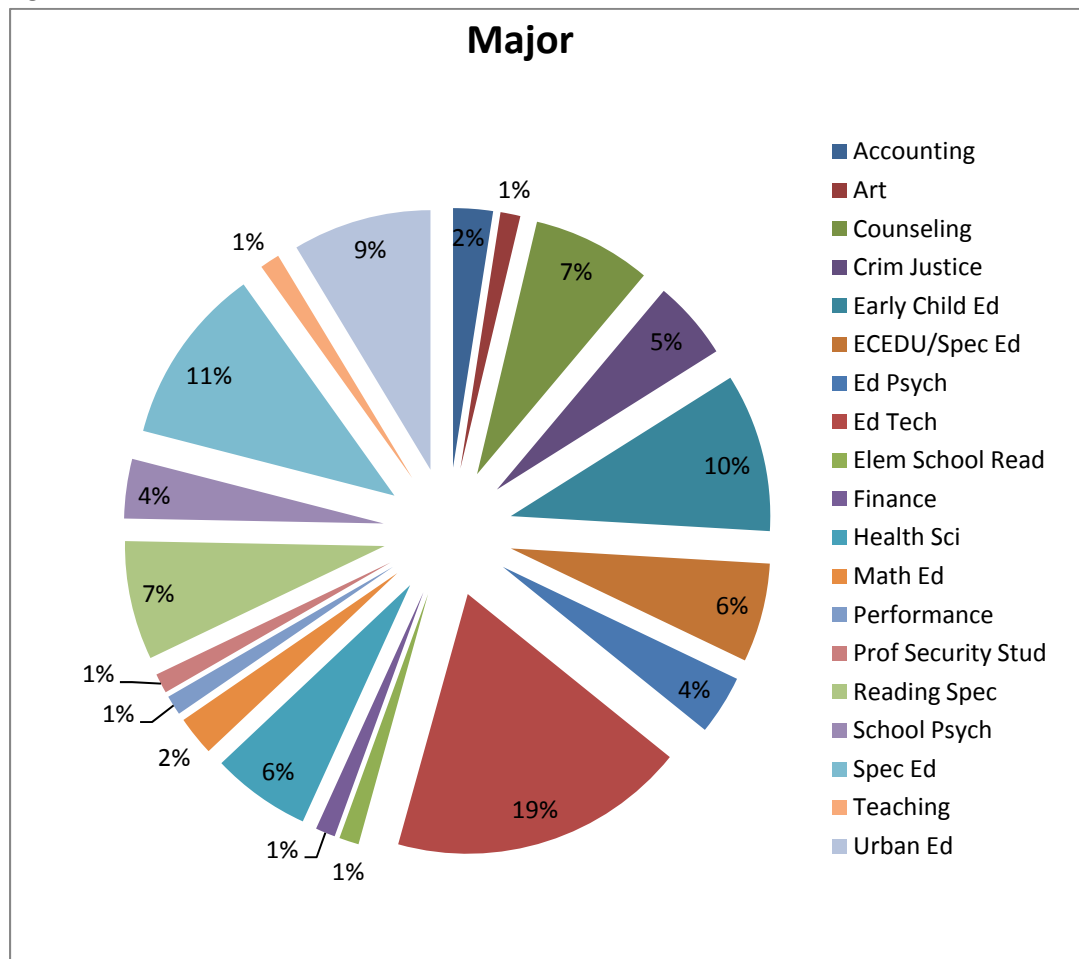
While in attendance at NJCU, most of the respondents lived in Hudson County (31%; n=27). The second most common lived in county was Bergen County at 15% (n=13). Students from other counties were as follows: Essex County (13%; n= 11), Passaic County (11%; n=9) and Monmouth County (6%; n= 5) (Figure 4).

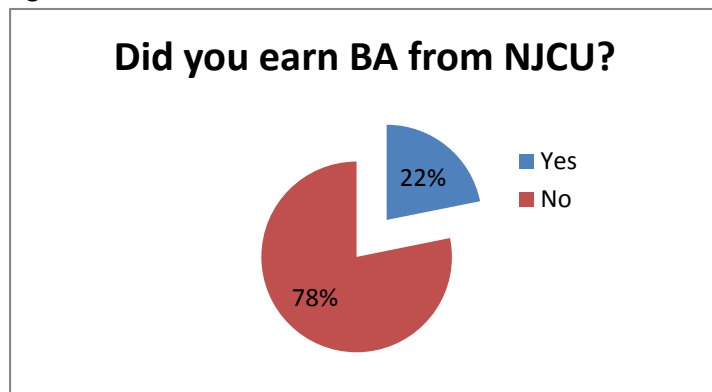
The most popular major of the responses was from those who majored in different areas of Education totaling 74% (n=60) (Figure 5).

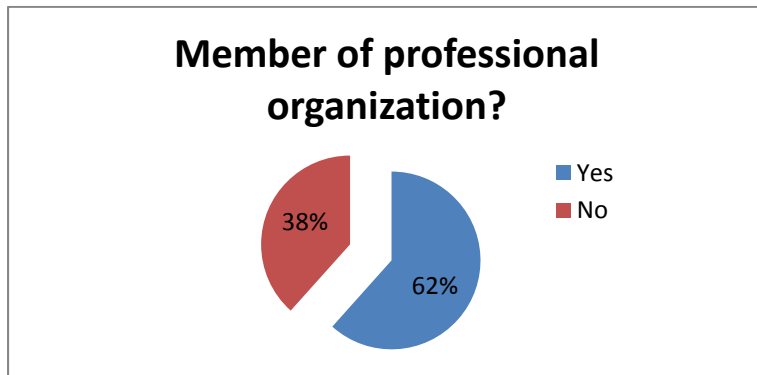
Twenty-two percent (n= 19) also received their bachelor's degrees from New Jersey City University while 78% (n=68) did not (Figure 6).

Sixty-two percent (n=53) of those who answered the survey are currently members of professional organizations (Figure 7).

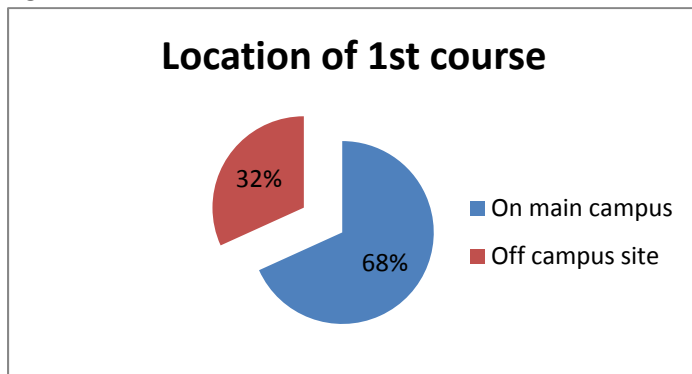

Graduate Student Years at NJCU:

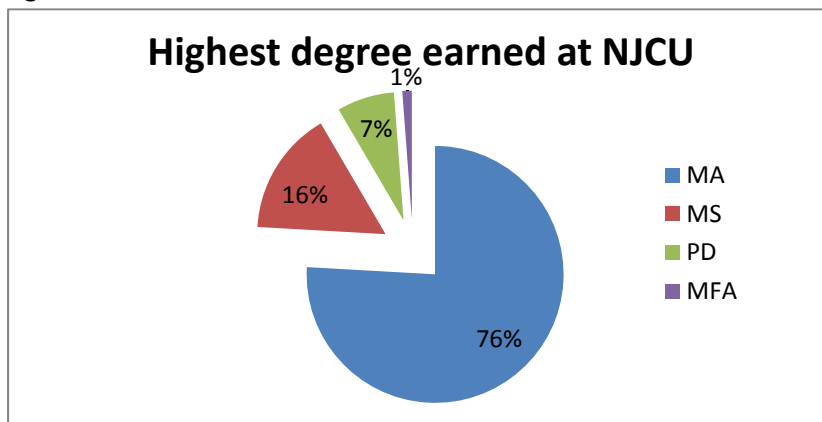
More than half of the respondents (68%; n=58) attended their first course on the main campus and 32% (n= 27) took their first course off site (Figure 8).

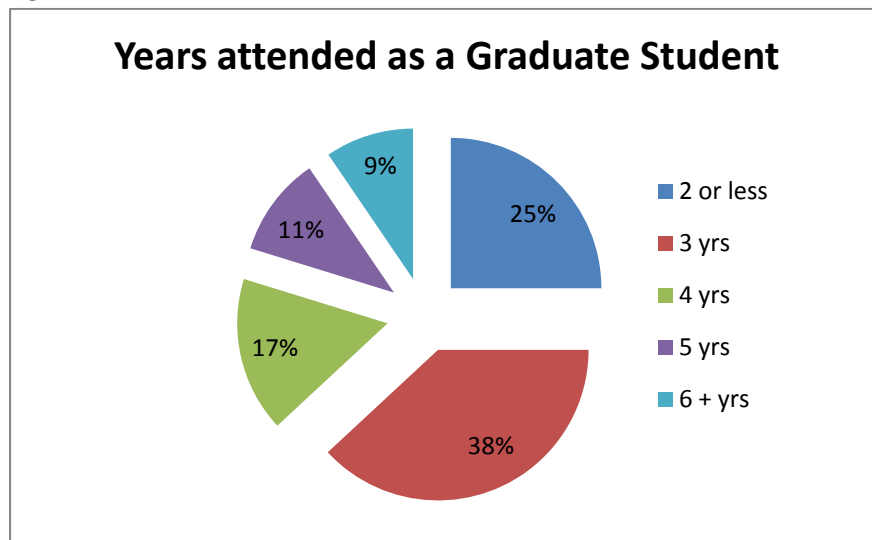
The highest degree most obtained from NJCU was the Master of Arts (76%; n=63) with the Master of Science degree coming in second at 16% (n=13) (Figure 9).

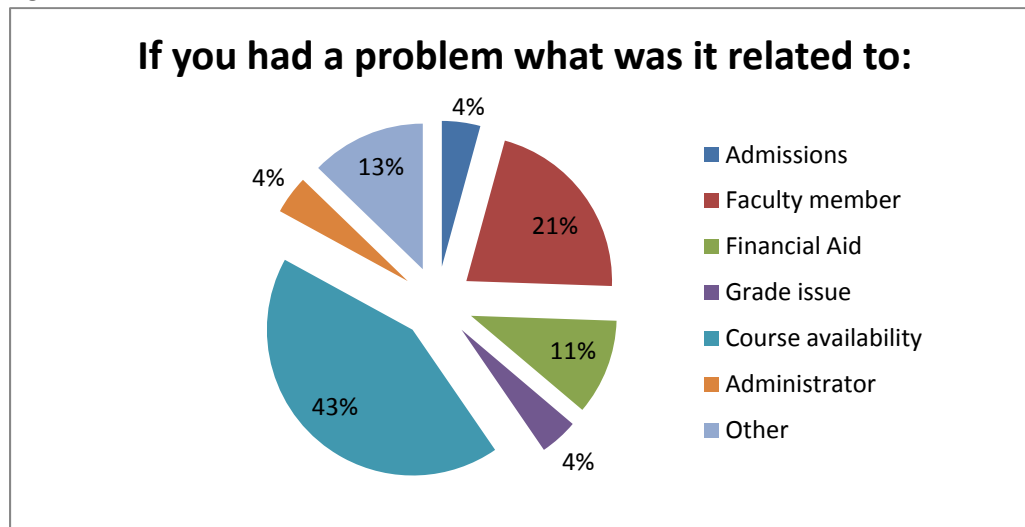
The greatest number (38%; n=32) took three years to complete their master's programs. Twenty-five percent (n= 21) completed their degrees in 2 years or less and 17% (n=14) took four years (Figure 10).

The respondents were asked if they had any problems during their studies at NJCU and what those problems were related to. Forty-three percent (n= 20) replied "Course availability" and 21% (n= 10) reported "Faculty member" (Figure 11).

Sixty-four percent (n=37) said that someone at the college was helpful with their problem. Fifty percent (n=18) reported that helpful person as being a Department Chairperson. Seventy-eight percent (n=49) reported a graduate faculty member as being helpful. (Figures 12, 13 and 14).

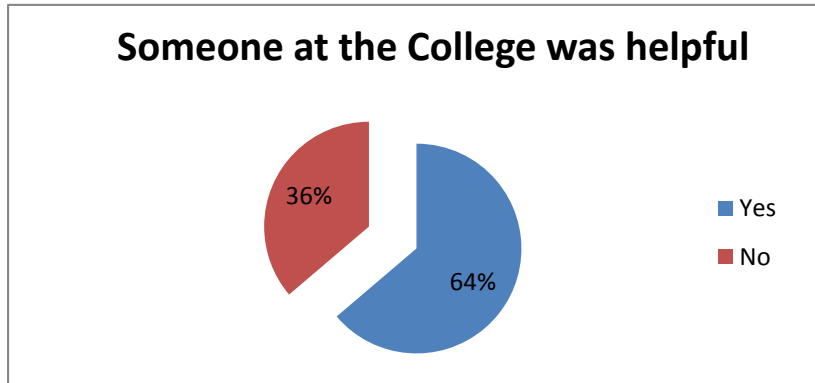

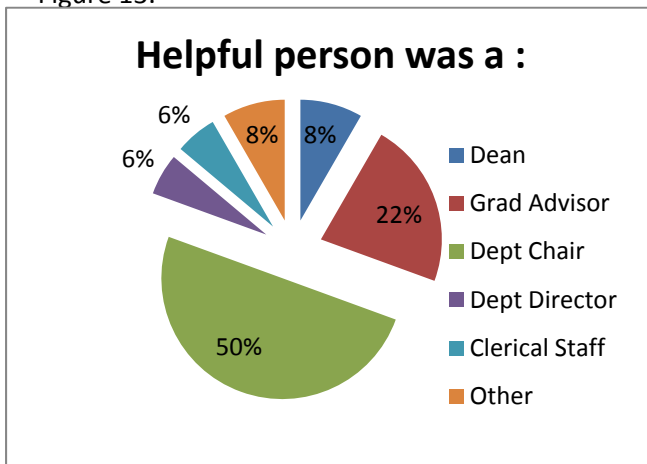
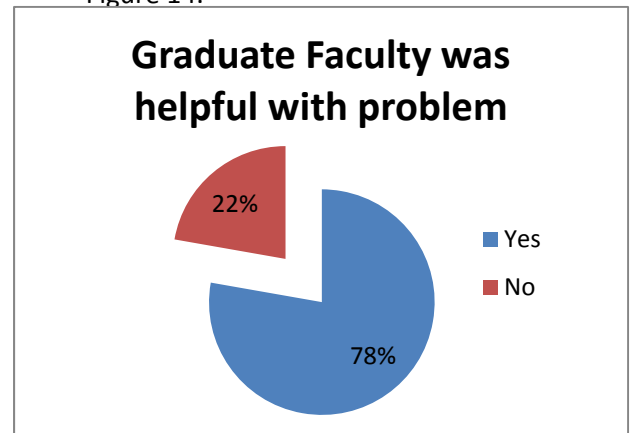
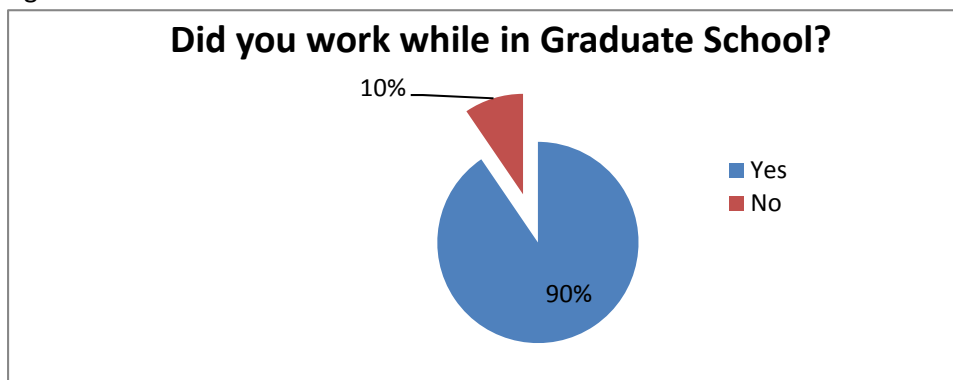

Ninety percent (n=76) of the graduate students said they worked while attending graduate school (Figure 15).

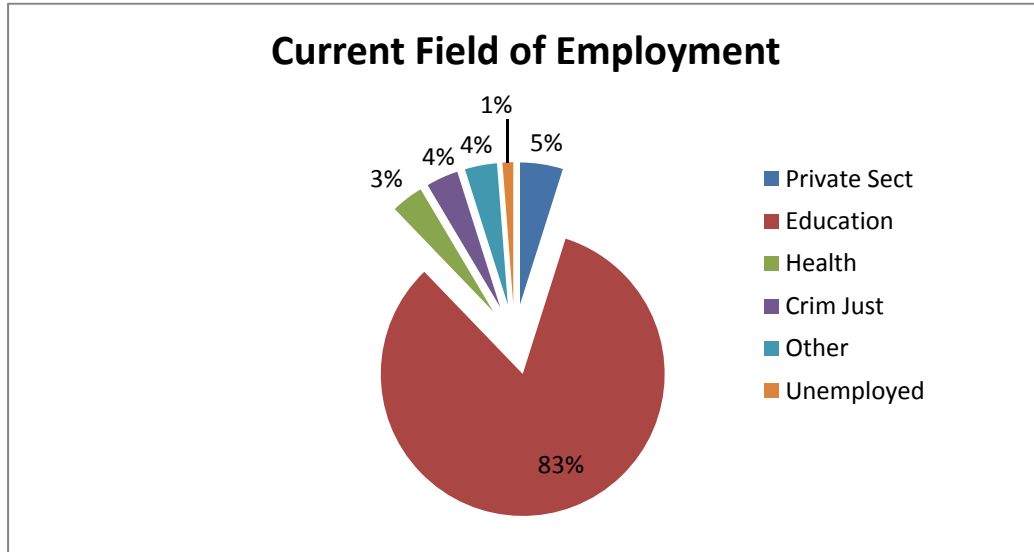

Current Employment/ Education Plans

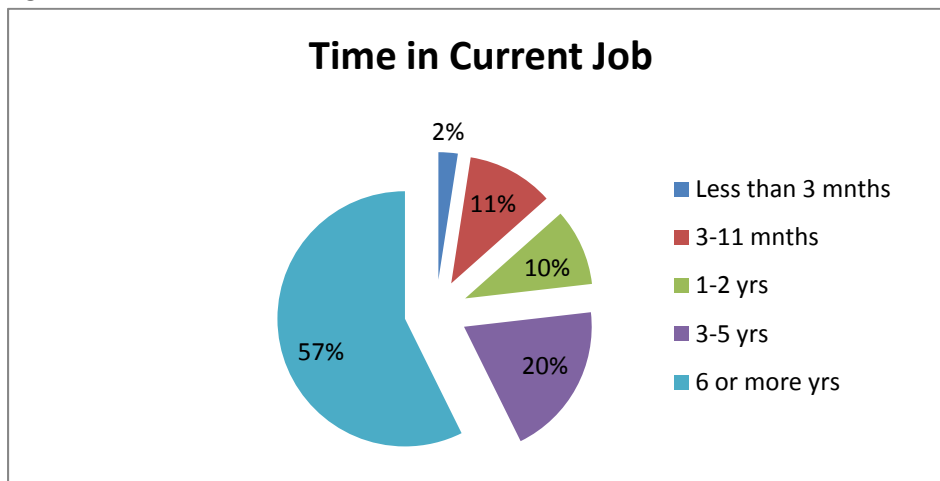
Eighty-three percent (n=68) of the respondents to the survey are currently employed in the education field. The few remaining respondents are evenly mixed among other fields of employment (Figure 16).

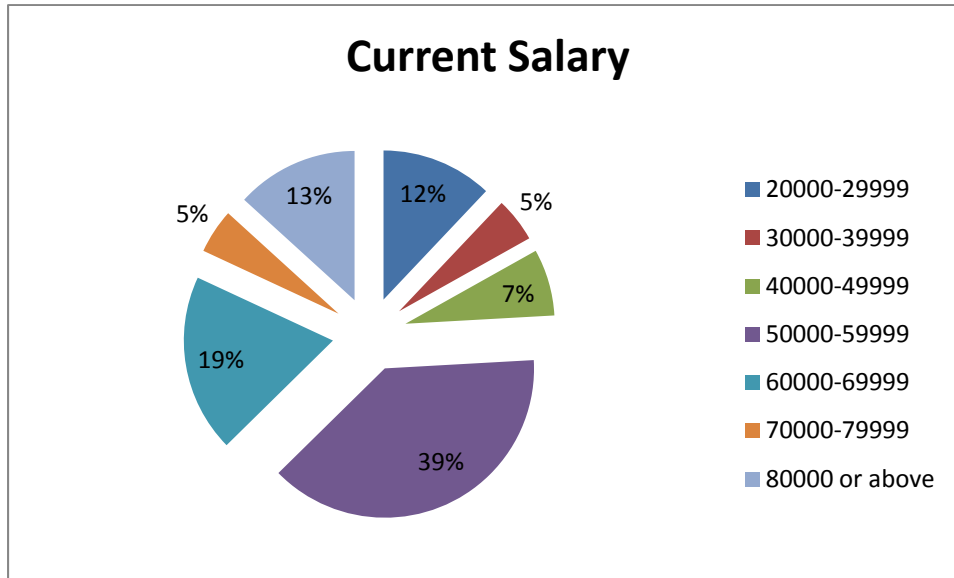
Fifty-seven percent (n=47) have been in their current job for 6 or more years and 20% (n=16) have been in their job for three to five years (Figure 17).

The highest number of respondents (39%; n=32) make a yearly salary of between \$50,000 and \$59,999 and 19% (n=16) make between \$60,000 and \$69,999 a year. Thirteen percent (n=11) are making over \$80,000 a year (Figure 18).

Of the respondents, 64% (n= 55) say they received a salary increase after graduation however 78% (n=67) did not receive a job promotion (Figures 19 and 20).

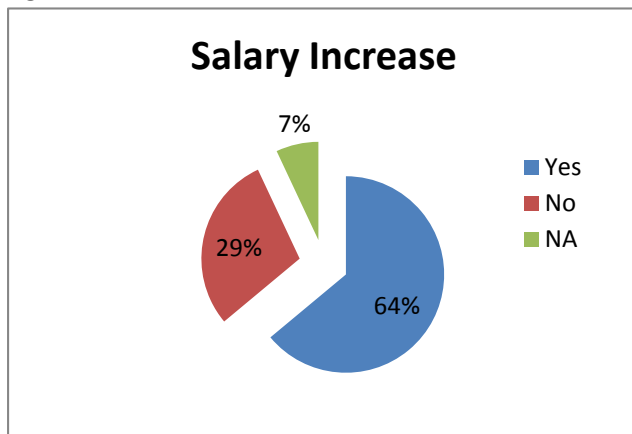
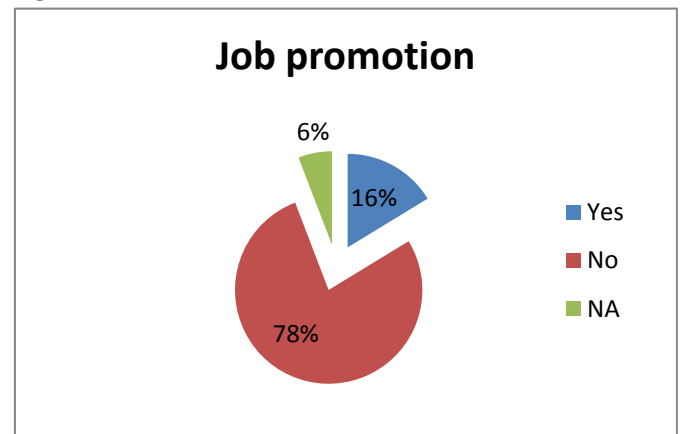
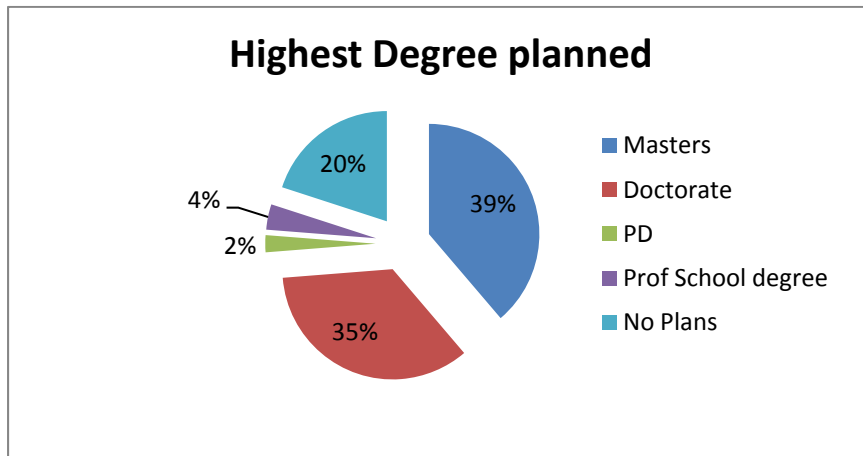

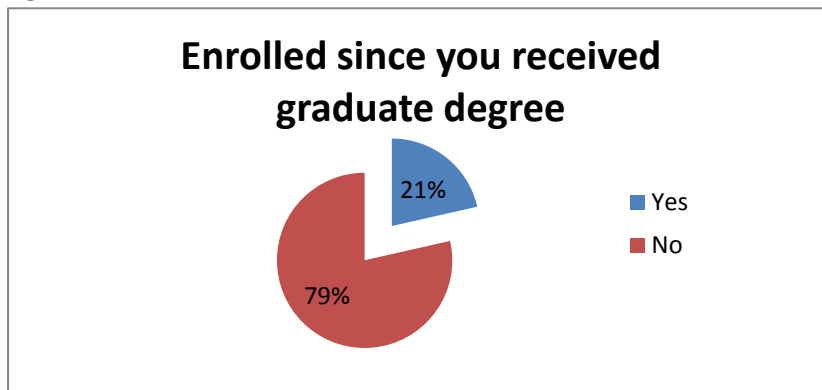
As for the highest degree they plan to obtain, 39% (n=31) stated a masters degree and 35% (n=28) stated a doctorate (Figure 21).

Twenty-one percent (n=18) have enrolled in courses since they received their master's degrees (Figure 22).

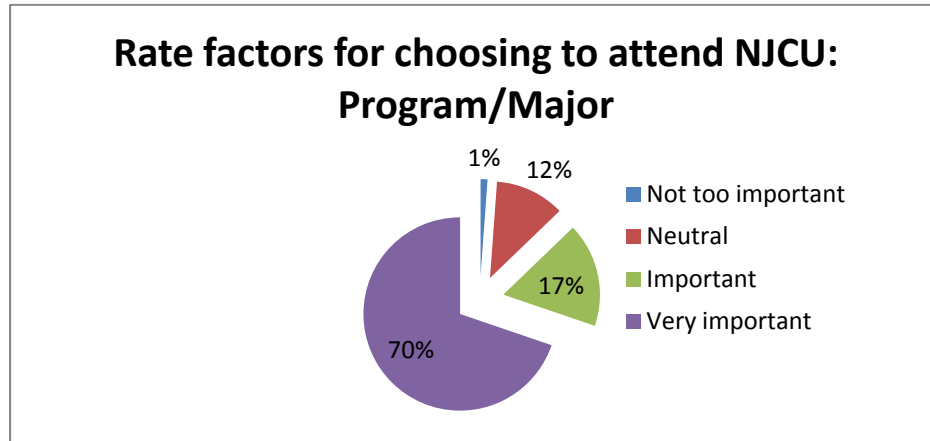

Ratings and Satisfaction with New Jersey City University:

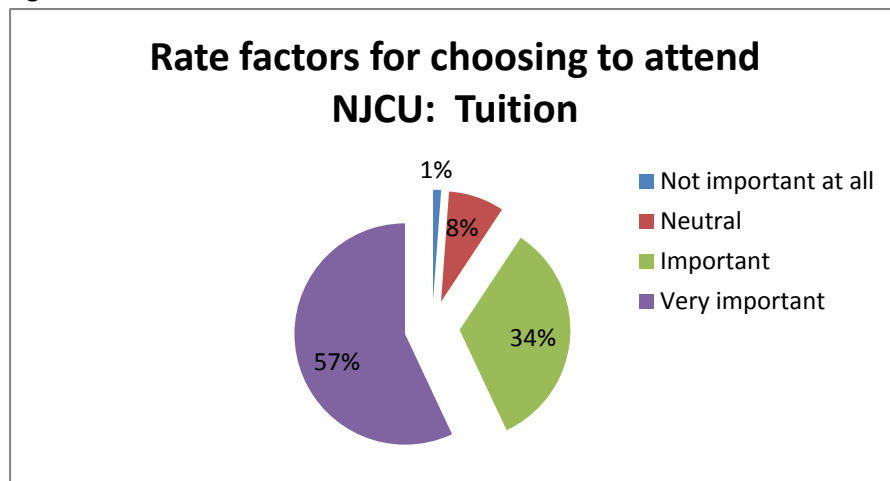
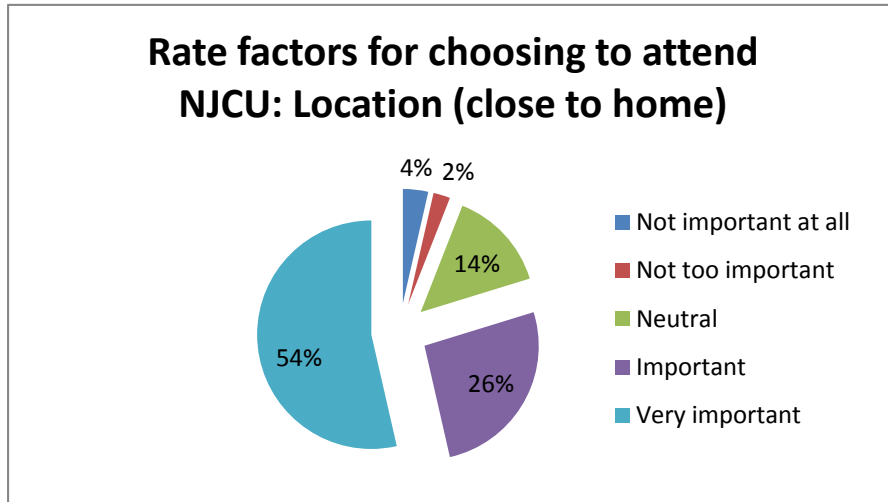

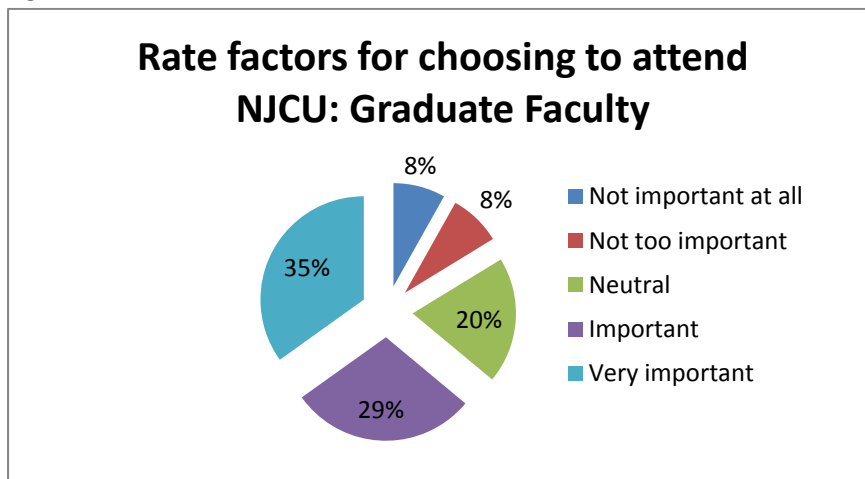
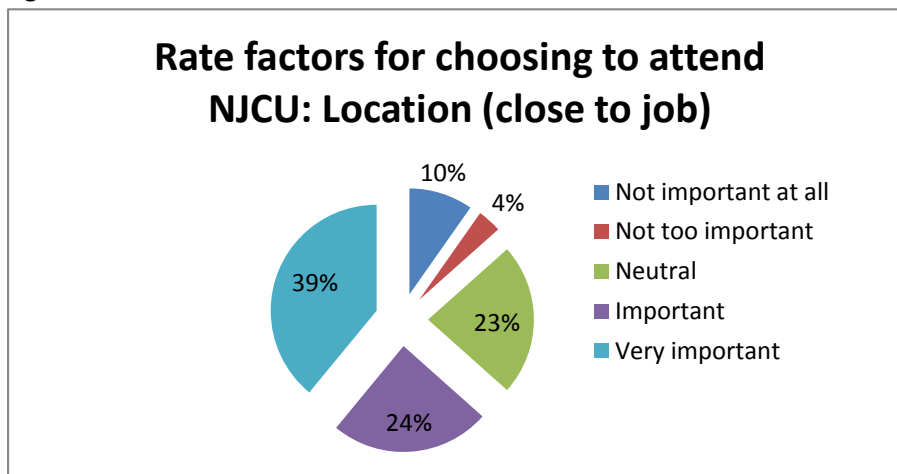
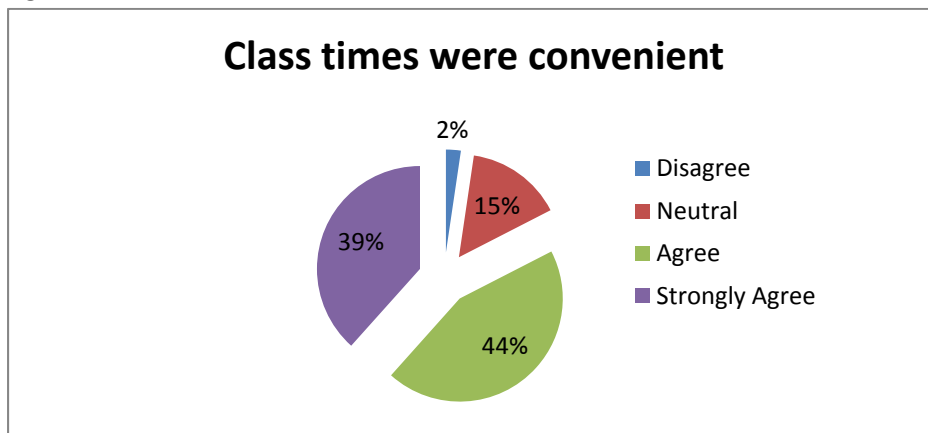

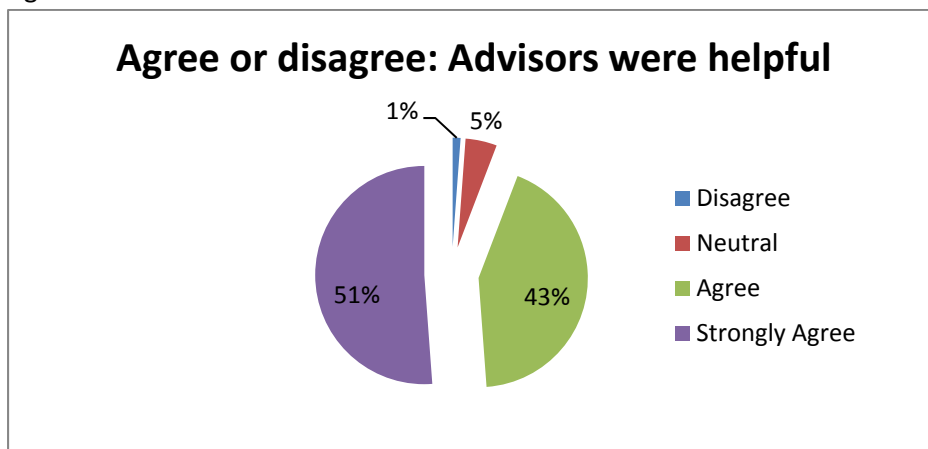
Eighty-three percent (n=119) of the survey takers agree that the hours of the class times were convenient and only 2% (n=2) disagree (Figure 28).

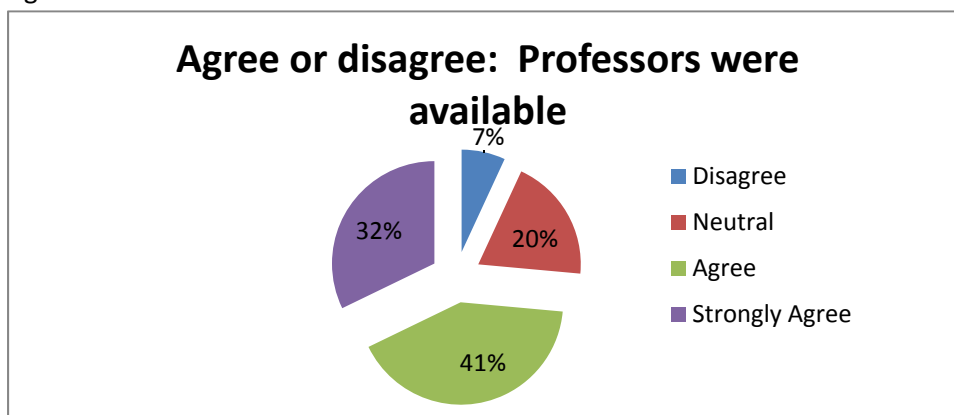
Ninety-four percent (n=81) agreed that advisors were helpful (Figure 29).

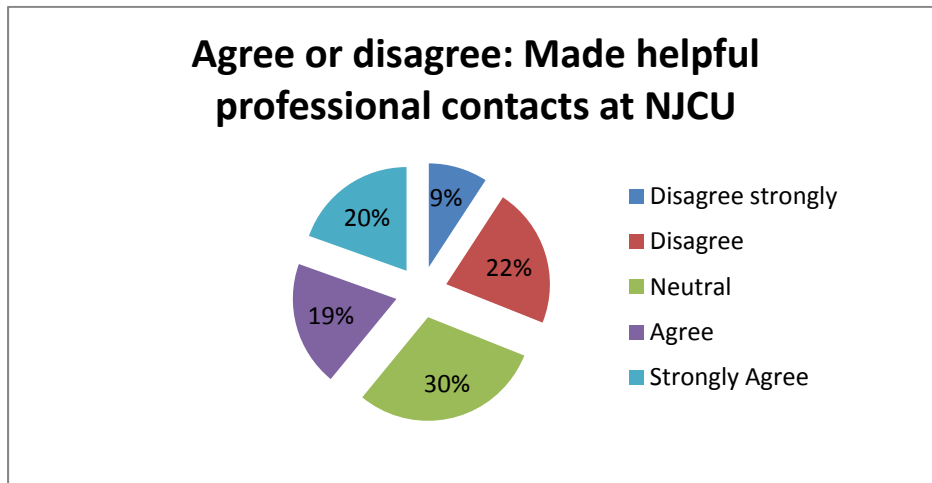
Seventy-three percent (n=64) agreed that their professors were available at convenient times (Figure 30).

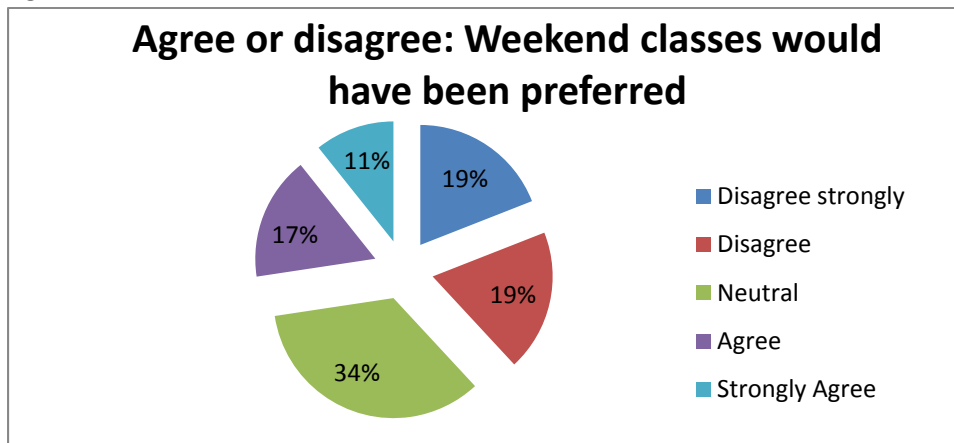
Thirty-nine percent (n= 34) agreed with the statement that they made helpful professional contacts at NJCU and 31% (n=27) disagreed (Figure 31).

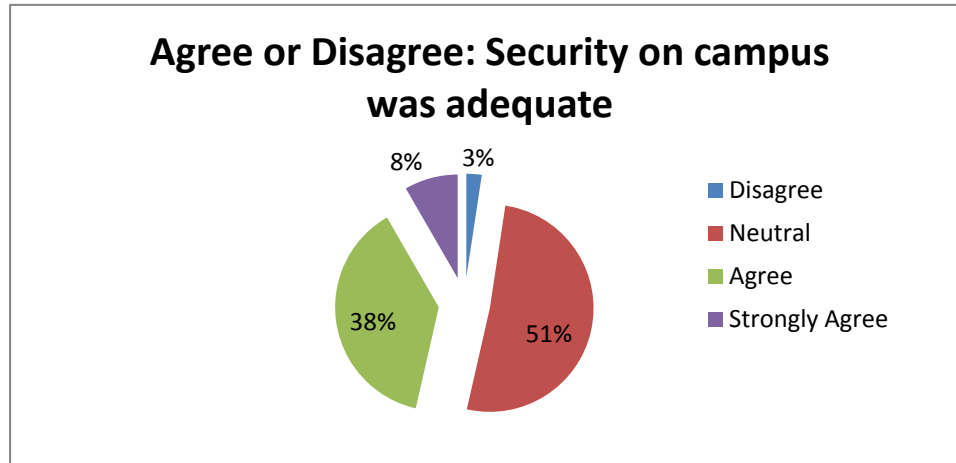
When asked if they would have preferred weekend classes, 72% (n=61) were either neutral or disagreeable to the idea (Figure 32).

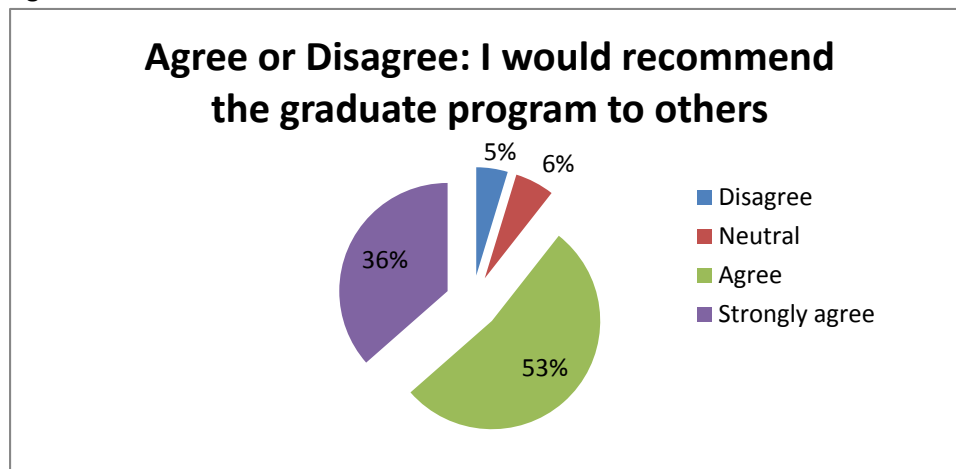

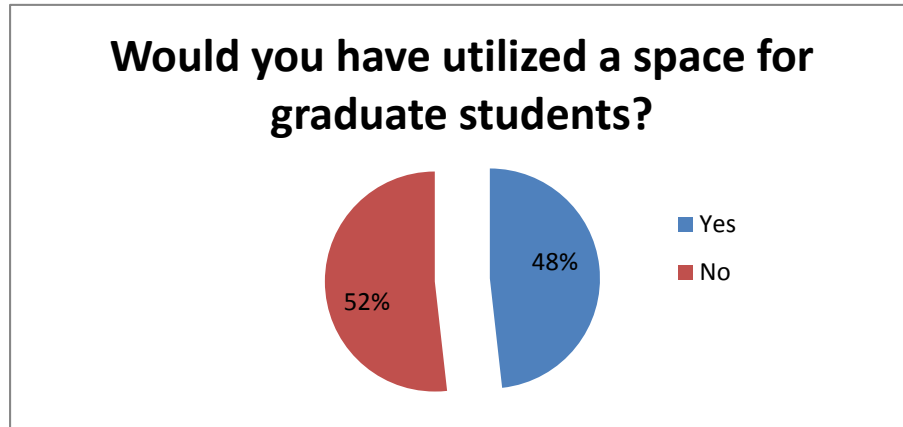
Based on their experience at NJCU, 89% (n=76) would recommend the graduate program to others (Figure 34).

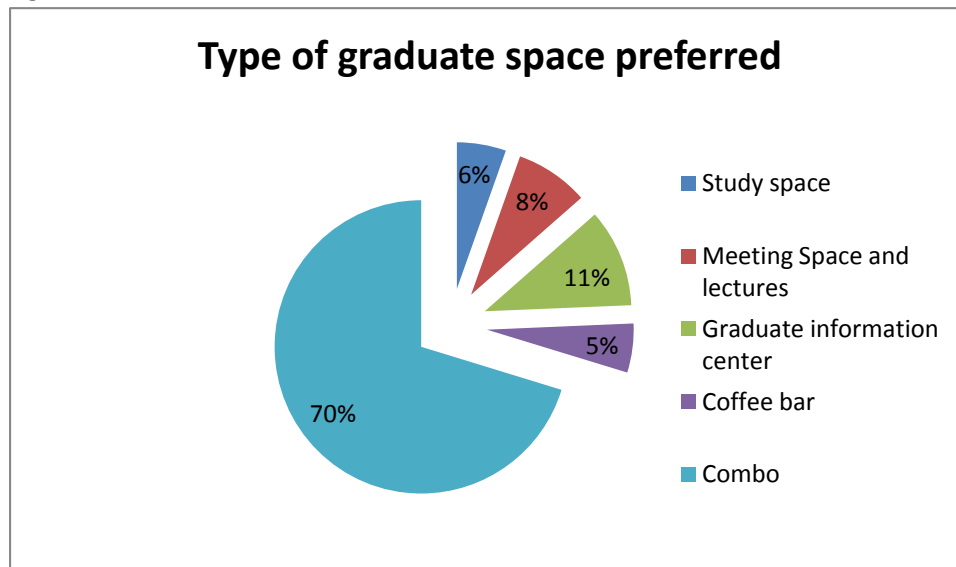
