184 incoming freshmen completed the BCSSE. An advising report is provided for each student. For instance, students for whom NJCU was not a first choice may be at risk of leaving. Those who spent little time in high school on reading or studying but plan to increase that may need help with the strategies. Students who expect a difficult transition but do not recognize the importance of support may need guidance. This document summarizes responses overall.
