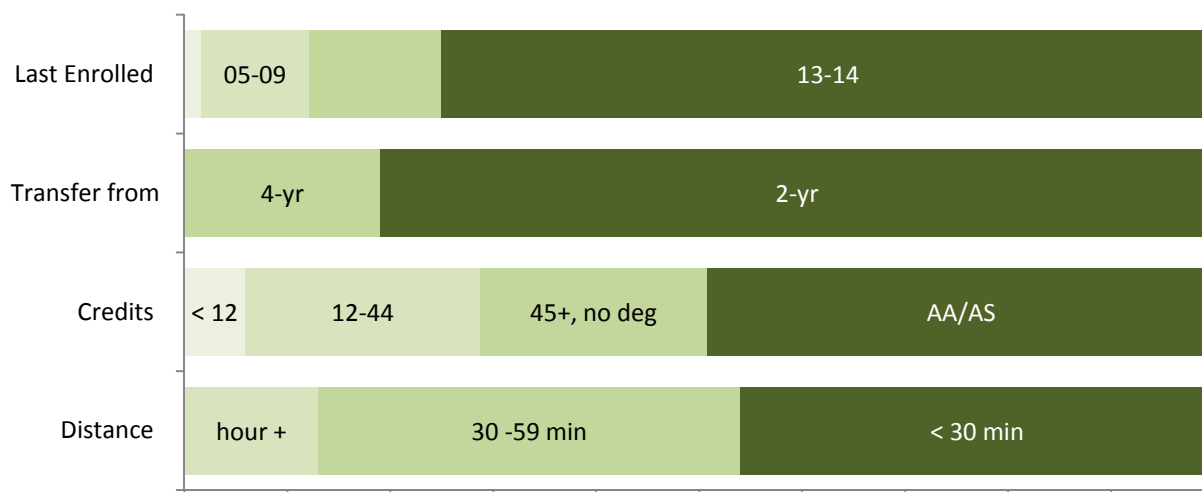


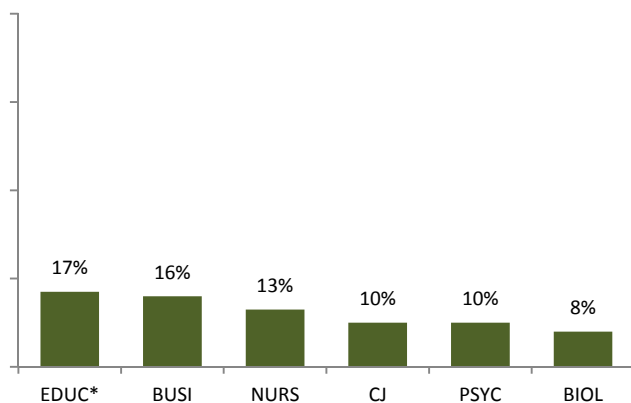
Who are NJCU Transfer Students?

- A total of 142 students participated the Transfer Orientation Survey
- NJCU's 2014 transfer students tend to come from community colleges, where they were enrolled in the previous two years, and earned either a degree or at least 45 credit hours in transfer.
- NJCU transfer students live less than one hour from campus.
- The most popular majors for transfer students who attend orientation are education and business, and students expect to graduate in two years.



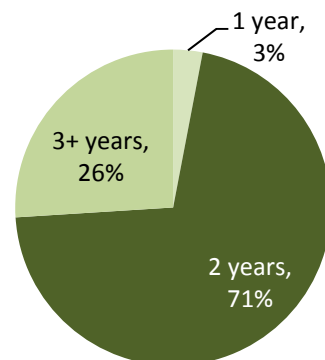

Most Popular Majors



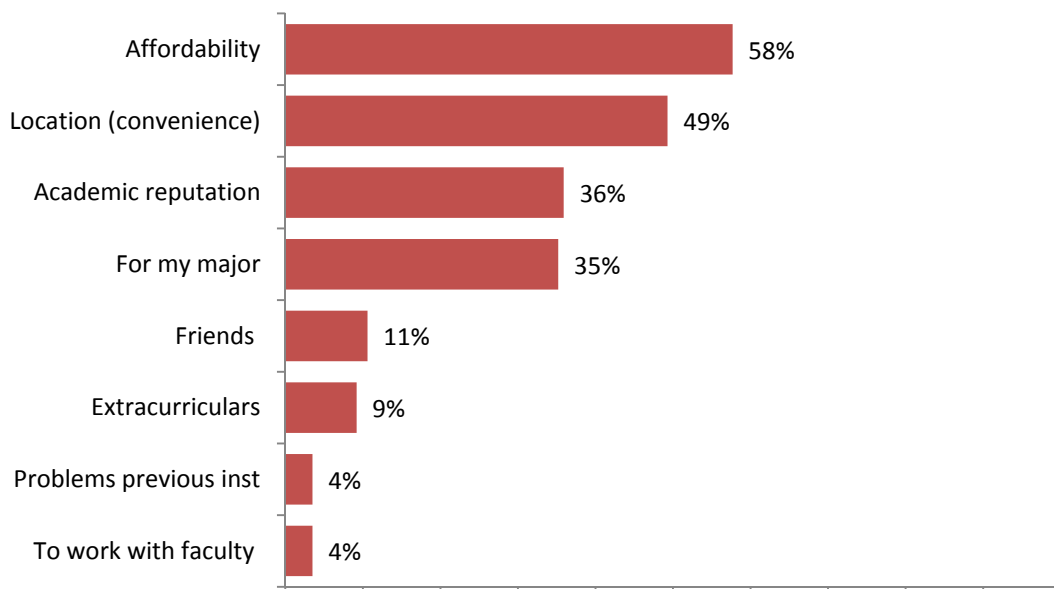

Expected Years to Graduate



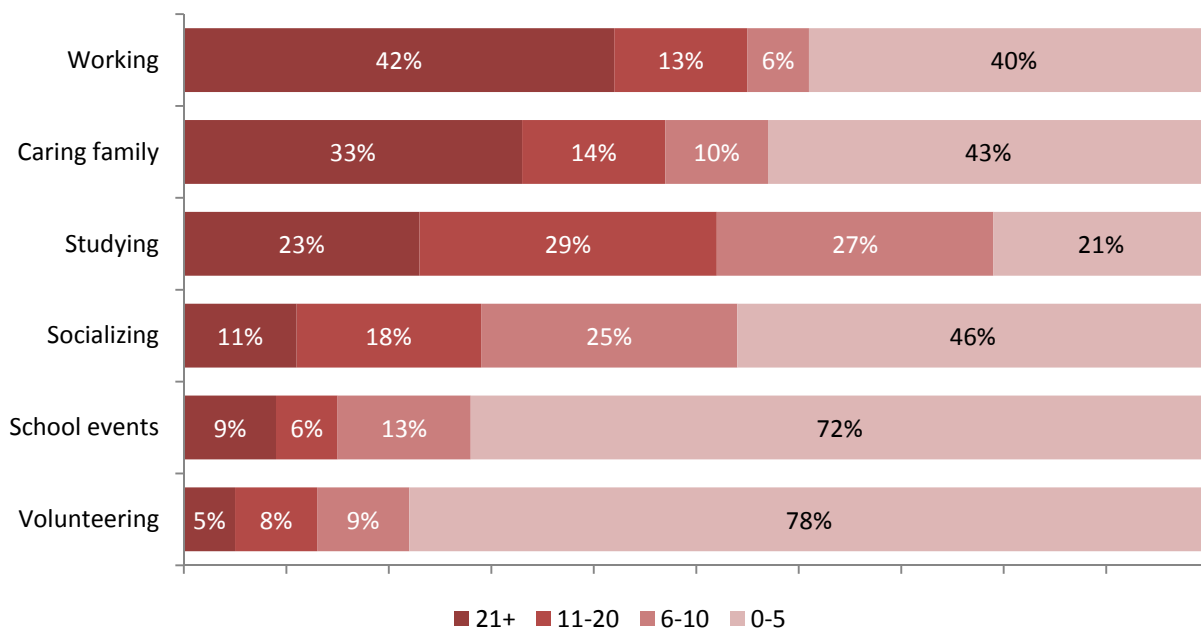
Why do students transfer to NJCU?

Affordability and convenience of location are the two biggest draws for transfer students.



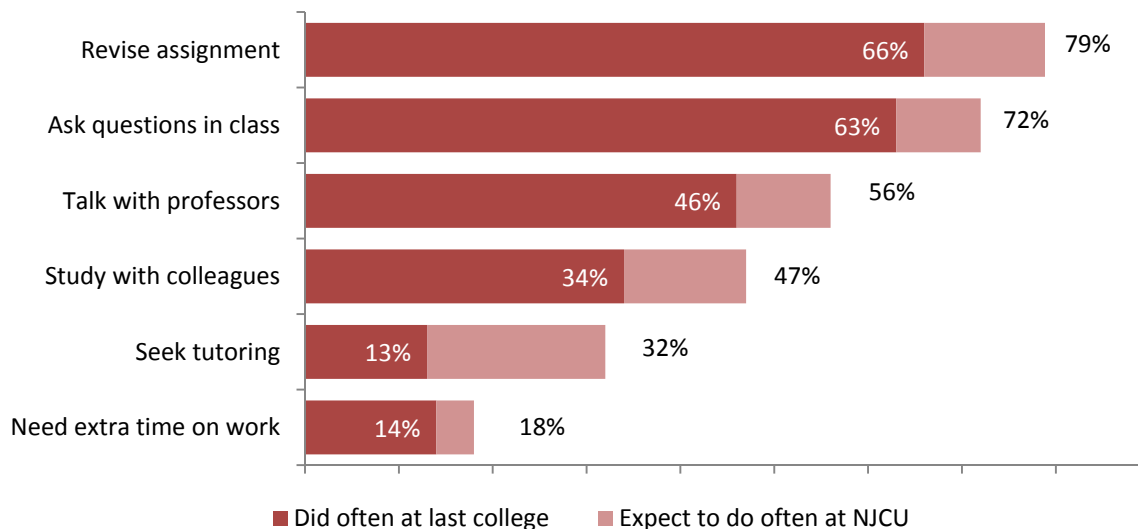
How did NJCU transfer students spend their time at their previous college?

- Students had varied study habits; 23% studied over 20 hours, while 21% studied at most 5 hours.
- There was also variability in employment; 42% worked more than 20 hours per week, but almost the same number (40%) worked very little, if all.
- One consistent was that students spent little time either at school events (72%) or volunteering (78%).



What were NJCU students' academic habits previously and what do they expect them to be at NJCU?

- Last year in college, over one-half of students revised assignments and asked questions in class.
- Last year in college, over one-third of students talked with professors and studied with colleagues.
- More students are planning to engage in each of the academic activities at NJCU than they did at their last college. The difference is greatest for seeking tutoring.



What is it important that NJCU provide?

- Receiving regular feedback on their academic progress from professors and having rich opportunities to explore careers are important to almost all these transfer students.
- Social events and clubs are of the least importance.
