

Master of Science in National Security Studies

NJCU's Master of Science degree in National Security Studies is the first comprehensive graduate program of its kind established in the State of New Jersey.

The Program requires 15 core credits that prepare students for graduate-level research as well as advanced classes in National Security, Corporate Security and Cyber Security. The student then specializes in one of these areas, progressing through nine additional credits that enhance their expertise in the area. A culminating, 12-credit experience completes the degree.

Graduate students who complete the Cyber Security core and specialization classes will be certified as Information Systems Security Officers, Standard 4014 (Entry Level) under authority of the National Security Agency, a certification program for information security professionals.


Admissions Requirements

Complete applications must include:

- Bachelor's degree from accredited institution of higher education
- Minimum 2.75 GPA
- Successful completion of any of the standardized graduate-level assessment tests. Requirement can be waived with undergraduate GPA of 3.3 or higher.
- Two academic or professional letters of recommendation
- Letter of interest
- Official transcripts
- Meet all of the minimum requirements of the University Admissions Office

Note:

An interview may be required at the discretion of the Graduate Coordinator.
