WAIVER OF ADVERTISING

COLLEGE BOARD

- WHEREAS: Pursuant to the New Jersey State Contracts Law (NJSA 18A: 64-56 et seq.) the University must advertise for bids on all contracts for goods and services which exceed \$32,100 except under circumstances specified in the statute where bids may be waived; and
- WHEREAS: As permitted by the statute, the University seeks authorization of the Board of Trustees under the New Jersey State Contracts Law Statute 18A: 64-56 a.3where any purchase, contract or agreement can be waived for materials or supplies which are not available from more than one potential bidder, including without limitations materials or supplies which are patented or copyrighted; and
- WHEREAS: To enter into a contract which exceeds the bid threshold without bidding with College Board for membership and participation in the Student Search Service; and
- WHEREAS: These services shall not exceed an annual amount of \$100,000; and
- WHEREAS: Whenever and wherever possible, the University intends to test the appropriateness of dealing with any given contract vendor by seeking alternate bids for the goods and services with other vendors, if available; and
- WHEREAS: The University is requesting a bid advertising waiver which will help ensure continuity, timeliness, and efficient operations; be it therefore
- RESOLVED: That the Board of Trustees of New Jersey City University on this 23rd day of February 2015 does hereby authorize the University to enter into a contract with the College Board.
