

2024-2025 Vital Statistical Report

Introduction

New Jersey City University's Department of Counselor Education received CACREP accreditation in 2014. Currently, CACREP has conferred accreditation on two master's programs: School Counseling (SC) and Clinical Mental Health Counseling programs (CMHC).

This vital statistical report is limited to only CACREP-accredited master 's-level programs: SC and CMHC. Data outcomes from the four areas of the counseling program are included in this report: (1) Student enrollment and demographics, (2) graduation and completion rate, (3) job placement rate, and (4) licensure examination passing rate.

For the Fall 2025 semester, the Department received 71 completed applications for the CMHC program and 9 completed applications for the SC program. NJCU's counseling department accepted 32 candidates (25 from CMHC and 7 from SC).

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For the Spring 2025 semester, the Department received 26 completed applications for the CMHC program and 8 completed applications for the SS program. NJCU's counseling department accepted 16 candidates (12 from CMHC and 4 from SC).

Graduation and Completion Rate

In the academic year 2024-2025, 36 students graduated from the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program, and 21 students graduated from the School Counseling program. The median years to complete both programs at NJCU is 3.7 years. CMHC students took an average of 3.5 years to graduate from the program, and SC students took an average of 3 years to graduate from the program.

Job Placement Rate and Licensure Examination Passing Rate

Of those who responded to follow-up surveys, 92% who wished to be employed were employed within six months of graduation.

Nine out of 12 recent graduate students are employed in a position directly related to their training at NJCU. Two graduate students are employed in a position somewhat (as a case-manager, counselor-aid) related to their training at NJCU. One student is still unemployed after six months of graduation.

For fall 2024, 11 Clinical Mental Health students sat for the National Counselor Examination (NCE). Out of 11, six students (55%) passed the NCE.

For spring 2025, 17 Clinical Mental Health students sat for the National Counselor Examination (NCE). Out of 17, 13 students (76%) passed the NCE. For School Counseling students, there is no mandatory requirement to pass any licensing or certification tests.
