She served as sole arbitrator in international disputes conducted under the Commercial Rules of American Arbitration Association, and has been involved in over 30 international commercial and investment arbitrations. Nwa'ndo Ume-Nwagbo is a co-founder of the Swithers + Ume-Nwagbo, LLC. General Counsel, and works with clients to resolve issues

concerning employee benefits and human resources. She and Roxann S. Smithers each worked in law for 10 years before they decided to focus their efforts towards serving business owners and entrepreneurs.
