The Latin American, Caribbean, and Latino Studies (LATI) Program at New Jersey City University addresses the need in our pluralistic society to broaden one's knowledge about Latin America, the Caribbean, and North Americans of Latin American and Caribbean ancestry.

This 18-hours credit program focuses on the complex geopolitical, economic, social, and environmental realities of the developing countries and territories to the south of the United States, with specific emphasis on the Caribbean region.

The Latin American, Caribbean, and Latino Studies Program also addresses the phenomenon of widespread migration of Latin American and Caribbean peoples to the United States and examines:

- the impact of United States society on the lifestyles of the various Latin American and Caribbean groups residing in this country
- the contribution of these groups to its culture and society; and
- the development of strategies to promote the enhancement of Latin American and Caribbean cultural identities and life conditions within the framework of the cultural, social, economic, and political spectrum of the United States.

Students with majors in most academic disciplines will be able to strengthen their area of study by minoring in Latin American, Caribbean, and Latino Studies. The program is offered both **on-campus** and **fully online** so that students can complete it in the manner most convenient to them. The minor helps students develop cross-cultural and transnational skills, as well as advance their analytical, critical thinking, and writing competences relevant
