- **Fiction**

- Is the story appealing to the intended audience?
- Is the plot plausible?
- Are there gaps in the plot?
- Are the characters well developed and believable?
- Does the reader get a clear sense of the setting?
- Is the problem or conflict believable?
- Does the book read smoothly, in a consistent voice?
- Is the style consistent and appropriate?
- Do you like the book? Would you recommend it to a middle school reader?

- **Nonfiction**

- Does the title reflect the book's purpose?
- Does the book accomplish its purpose?
- Is the book readable as well as accurate?
- Does the book align with the intended audience/grade curriculum standards?
- Are the text features appropriate and well executed?
- Is the text structure easy to recognize?
- Can the reader easily use the text structures to improve comprehension and recall?
- What are the author's qualifications for writing on this topic?
- Do you like the book? Would you recommend to a middle school reader?
