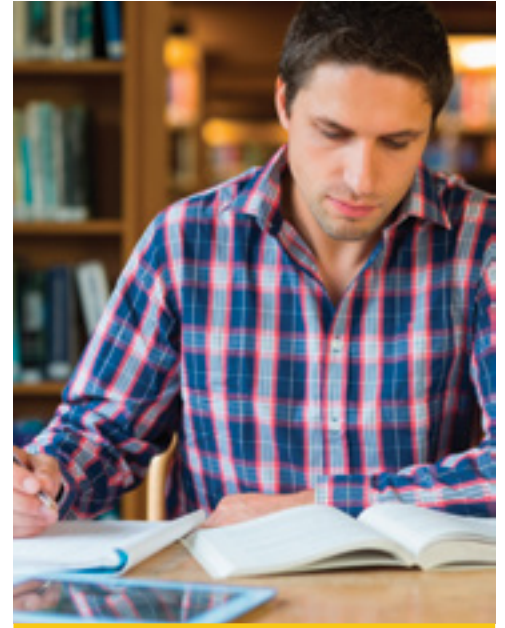
Bachelor of Science in National Security Studies

NJCU's nationally-acclaimed National Security Studies Program offers the only Bachelor of Science degree of its kind in New Jersey.

The Program equips students with a comprehensive understanding of national, corporate and cyber security theories and practices, and prepares them to operate on a supervisory level within security, law enforcement and business environments.

Of the 120 credits required to graduate from NJCU, students must complete 27 core and 12 elective credits in National Security Studies. Those interested in the National Security Agency (NSA) Certification for Information Security (INFOSEC) must also complete Computer Security II and Computer Security III.

With flexibility built into this innovative program, students are encouraged to dual major or minor in a number of areas, including business, math, chemistry, languages, criminal justice and military science.

Undergraduate courses are offered at NJCU's main campus in Jersey City and at the University's satellite campuses in Wall, NJ and Edison, NJ.
