

 - Given out over 300 computers to students and over 100 to faculty/staff
 - Distributed hot spots to students in need
- Identified "missing" students and working with them to get their needs met

 - Using the latest CDC guidelines for safety of students and employees

 - Meetings three times per week
 - Topics have included:

What We Have Done

Residence Life

- Staffed daily Monday-Thursday from 9-5pm to address student issues.
- There is an on-call system where the RAs and the professional staff are available 24/7 365 days
- The counselor in residence is holding virtual counseling sessions

Counseling Center

• Staff have individual appointments with students, group sessions, and virtual "walk-in" hours daily





What We Have Done

Center for Leadership and Engagement

- Weekly virtual programs such as guest speakers, movie nights, meditation, and student leadership.
- Up to 250 participants for the Instagram Live chats.
- Virtual student leadership awards luncheon for students
- Virtual volunteerism and Campus Compact initiatives

Tutoring

- Spearheading outreach to ACES program (students on probation)
- For the summer they will be working with EOF programs regarding virtual tutoring and assisting with in-class teaching
- There is an academic coach as well as a counseling intern to help students with life issues that are identified in tutoring sessions

What We Know

- State Operating Support Frozen
 - \$5.1 million
 - State will move the new year from 7/1 to 10/1
- Federal Stimulus Package Starting to arrive
 - \$8.4 million from CARES
 - GEER Funds
 - Advocating for \$2M from the State
 - MSI Funds in CARES Act (1.047 Billion)
 - 214M in HSI funds


