#### **Accounting Department Career Success**



The <u>Accounting Department</u> has successfully placed an average of 30 students into accounting firms, including the prestigious Big Four as well as national firms, over the past several years. The department maintains strong relationships with these firms and hosts annual on-campus recruiting events, providing valuable networking opportunities for students. As a result, many accounting majors secure full-time positions even before graduation.

PwC, one of the Big Four International Accounting Firms, hosted their annual dinner at Fire and Oak at the Westin Hotel at Jersey City and invited NJCU alumni who are current PwC staff and new interns along with NJCU faculty. Will Eaves, a PwC partner and member of the NJCU Foundation Board of Directors, was also present at the event. The NJCU interns and employees were able to build their networks and get insights into what it is like to work at PwC.

The Accounting Department also prepares students each year through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. As part of this initiative, students receive specialized training to assist low-income individuals with tax preparation. The department partners with the local nonprofit organization, HOPES CAP, Inc., to offer these services, allowing students to file

tax returns for low income residents in Hudson County. This hands-on experience not only benefits the community but also equips students with practical skills in tax preparation, while fostering a sense of social responsibility and professional growth.


