Research Background and Purpose: Changes in the global supply chain continue to accelerate due to shifts in U.S. tariff policies and other factors. This study aims to analyze various indicators—such as container throughput at major U.S. ports, freight volume on key rail lines, cross-border trade volumes, and utilization rates of U.S. warehouse facilities, etc.—to examine and forecast changes in the North American logistics market, thereby deriving implications.
