Finding Fiction books

followed by a letter and numbers

B26945w

S629a

and sometimes a <u>c</u> or a <u>v</u> and a number

v.2

c.4

or sometimes a year

1987

2003

Finding Fiction Books on the Shelves

Read the call number

line by line

juv

B26945w

v.2

1987

- Look on the <u>Juvenile Fiction</u> shelves in the B's
- 2. Find the B 20,000's Then look for 26945
- 3. Remember these are decimal numbers so **B26945** will be before B27(000)
- 4. Then look for the w (which usually stands for the title.)
- Then look for the v.2 (which usually stands for the volume.)

Then find the last number **1987** (year of publication).



Picture Fiction Books and easy Chapter Books are on the low shelves in front of the elevator




Older Fiction Chapter

Non-fiction

Nonfiction - is the opposite of fiction.

Books that are nonfiction, or true, are about real things, people, cultures (like fairy tales, myths and religions) events, and places.

Finding NonFiction Books

Books will have a

juv or j followed by numbers

383.11 398.21

followed by a letter and numbers and a lower case letter

N337c A842z

and sometimes a <u>c</u> or a <u>v</u> and a number

c.2 c.1

Finding NonFiction Books on the Shelves

Read the call number

line by line

juv

383.11

N337c


c.2

- 1. Look on the <u>Juvenile NonFiction</u> shelves in the 300's
- 2. Then look for 383, and then 383.11
- 3. Remember these are decimal numbers so **383.11** will be before 383.2(0)
- 4. Then look for the **N337** (which usually stands for the author.)
- 5. Then look for c (the first letter of the title)
- 6. Then look for the **c.2** (which usually stands for the copy number.)



NonFiction books (all levels) are on the first section of the tall shelves to the right of the elevator

Left-to-right, Top-to-bottom



Now, if you're having trouble finding your book on the shelf, remember this rule for how the books are shelved:

left-to-right, top-to-bottom

That means you start at the left on the top shelf and move to the right until the shelf ends.

Read the shelves like you would the page of a book
