

## YOU NEED TO KNOW

### After completing the Law Enforcement Program, you will:

- Know how to write an effective report that generates a solid account of observations and actions.
- Comprehend the fundamentals of community policing and be able to apply them effectively.
- Know the basic concepts of arrest, search, and seizure and how they pertain to the Fourth Amendment rights for suspected individuals.
- Understand the search-warrant writing process.

### After completing the Medical Training, you will:

- Recognize several life-threatening emergencies, provide CPR, use an AED, and relieve choking in a safe, timely and effective manner.
- Be prepared to respond to a cardiac arrest or choking emergency.
- Have critical skills to immediately respond to and manage an emergency until Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrives.
- Know how to respond to and manage illnesses and injuries in a child or infant until professional help arrives.
