

NJCU'S FIRE SAFETY MANAGER PROGRAM

This course is specifically designed to train individuals to become eligible to work in the capacity of a Fire Safety Manager in the City of Jersey City. According to Jersey City's ordinance # 01-088, it is required that one employee shall be designated as "Fire Safety Manager," and that one or more employees be designated as "Deputy Fire Safety Manager" for all high-rise buildings.

To be eligible to work as a Fire Safety Manager in the City of Jersey City, individuals must complete an approved program and subsequently earn a passing grade on the Jersey City Fire Safety Manager Certification Examination.



WHAT IS A FIRE SAFETY MANAGER?

A fire safety manager is responsible for safeguarding others' lives and properties by planning, composing, implementing, and supervising fire safety plans that take care of specific fire and life safety systems. To effectively carry out the job description, the fire safety manager works closely with many people and, in some cases, also supervises their activities.

PROGRAM COURSES

The course meets for six classroom sessions or modules for hands-on learning, including lectures from certified and experienced instructors from building code enforcement, security, and several emergency service branches.

Students will also receive a specialized course workbook, reference manual, and a CD containing templates of recommended and required forms, log sheets, and reports. Additionally, all students will receive an emergency checklist for immediate use at the emergency command post location in your building.
