# Who Needs to File Taxes?

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- Students who did not work for pay, but were in the US for any part of 2022
- Students who worked for pay on-campus or off-campus (CPT or OPT) in the US during 2022
- Students who received scholarship beyond the cost of tuition in 2022

# Students Who Did Not Work For Pay

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- If you DID NOT WORK for pay in 2022, you and your dependents need to file **only Form 8843**.

- Fill out Part I and Part III. Sign the form, and send by the due date to the address below:

- If you were employed for pay in the US during any part of the 2022 calendar year, you should have received a W-2 form in the mail.
- If you have not received your W-2 Form, contact your employer's Payroll Office.
