

Overview

In May 2016, University Advancement and the Office for Institutional Effectiveness collaborated on a graduating student survey. Advancement staff administered the survey during commencement gown pick-up. A total of 1160 graduating students completed the survey, 877 undergraduates, 274 master-level students, and 9 doctoral students. This document reports on responses from the undergraduate and master levels (referred to as graduate).

Respondents

Most individuals indicated their primary major only, so this classification is used throughout this report. The distribution of major for respondents is generally consistent with the University, with psychology and criminal justice having most responses at the undergraduate level and education at the graduate level.

Future Plans

Respondents reported on their plans for the coming year. Individuals were able to select multiple plans, including: stay at current job, search for another job, start a new job they recently accepted, and further their education in graduate school. Overall 60% of undergraduates were planning to engage in a job search. Graduates, planned to both stay at current job (49%) and search for another job (47%).
